The church must be ready for the next worship service. All chairs in the dining room should be put on the chair rack. The white tables may be left up. The kitchen needs to be put back in order. Make sure the bathrooms are tidy. Trash should be bagged and put in the garbage containers out back of the church. Sanctuary hymnals should be put back in the racks of the pews. Items left in the church should be picked up. Carpets should be vacuumed if necessary. Any items belonging to the church emonade should not leave the church without permission from the WELCA co-chair or the church president. Zoar Church council established a policy regarding the use of the church's tables and chairs: Chairs may be used for \$1 a funeral home in advance. All chair, only the older brown tables

may be rented for \$5.00 each, the white tables should not leave the church.
